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Evaluation Strategy

- **Generate data that**
 - Highlights what is and isn't working within the Adolescent Health Project (AHP)
 - Can be shared with and used by key stakeholders on an ongoing basis
 - Informs the improvement of the initiatives within the Adolescent Health Project (AHP)
- **Re-assess evaluation plan on an ongoing basis to ensure it meets the needs of the AHP**




Evaluation Questions

- **Process Evaluation**
 - How well are different aspects of the AHP being implemented?
 - In what ways are youth engaging with the AHP?
- **Outcome Evaluation**
 - To what degree are STD testing and treatment behaviors changing?
 - To what degree are the contraceptive behaviors of youth changing?
 - Are teen pregnancy and STD rates decreasing?
- **Developmental Evaluation**
 - In what ways are community relationships and systems changing as a result of the AHP?




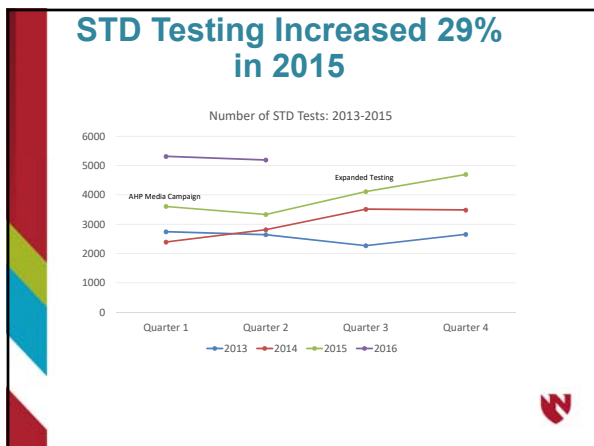
Evaluation Methods

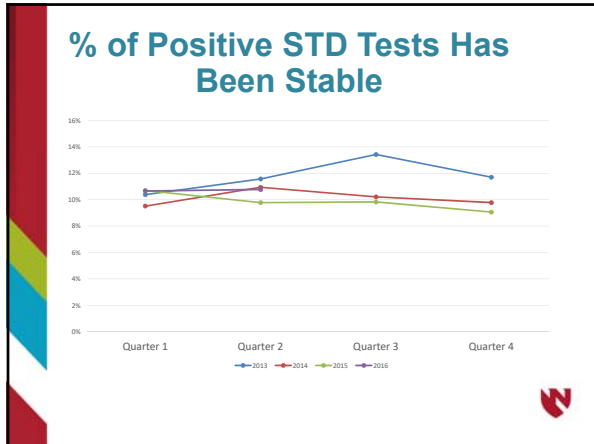
- **Quantitative Data**
 - Monthly STD testing/treatment grantee reports
 - Bi-monthly Contraceptive Access grantee reports
 - Patient satisfaction surveys
 - County level data
 - OPS curriculum evaluation
- **Qualitative Data**
 - Interviews with community leaders and youth
 - Meeting notes (e.g., Omaha Public Schools board meetings)

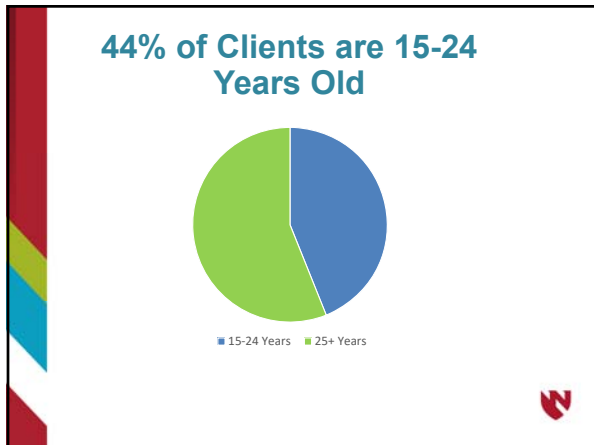


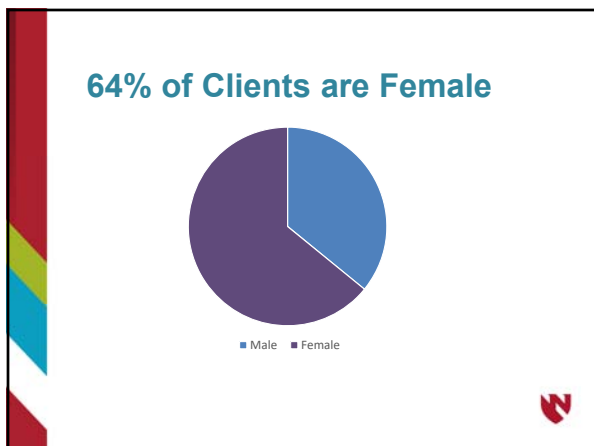
STD Testing Results

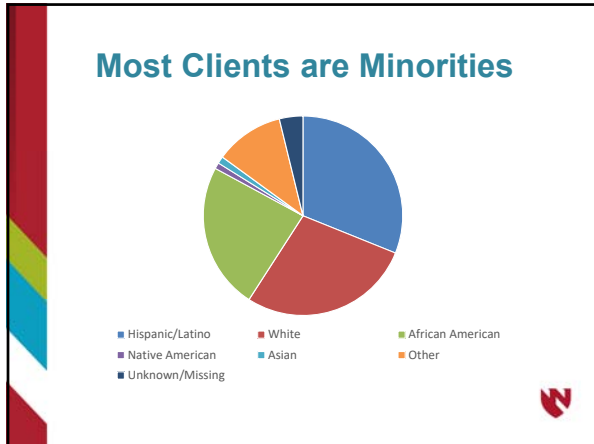












- ### Next Steps
